Local Food Connect is working to reactivate Fabbro's Farm as a vibrant urban farm for the Nillumbik community.

THE NEW FABBRO'S FARM WILL:

- Grow vegetables for local consumption
- Grow produce using organic principles
- Offer the local community a diverse range of educational and community building activities
- Increase the vibrancy and liveability of Nillumbik
- Provide an opportunity to recognise Nillumbik's Indigenous heritage and agricultural past
- Be self-sustaining

Urban farm example: Mossy Willow Farm, Mornington Peninsula



Eltham was once a farming district and its last farm belonged to the Fabbro family. The remaining part of Fabbro's Farm is located in Bell Street on prime alluvial market garden land. It was farmed from at least 1933 until Maurie Fabbro passed away in 2009.

The fundamental purpose of the New Fabbro's Farm will be to inspire our community to take action that leads to healthier lives and to eat in a manner that is respectful of our fragile planet.

There will be many options for the community to be involved in farm activities. Volunteering, sharing knowledge about vegetable growing, farm tours and by eating fresh local produce..

An urban farm will develop greater community awareness of the importance of what we choose to eat and the relationship between food, health, and climate change.
